DECLARATION IN SUPPORT OF APPLICATION FOR ARREST WARRANT

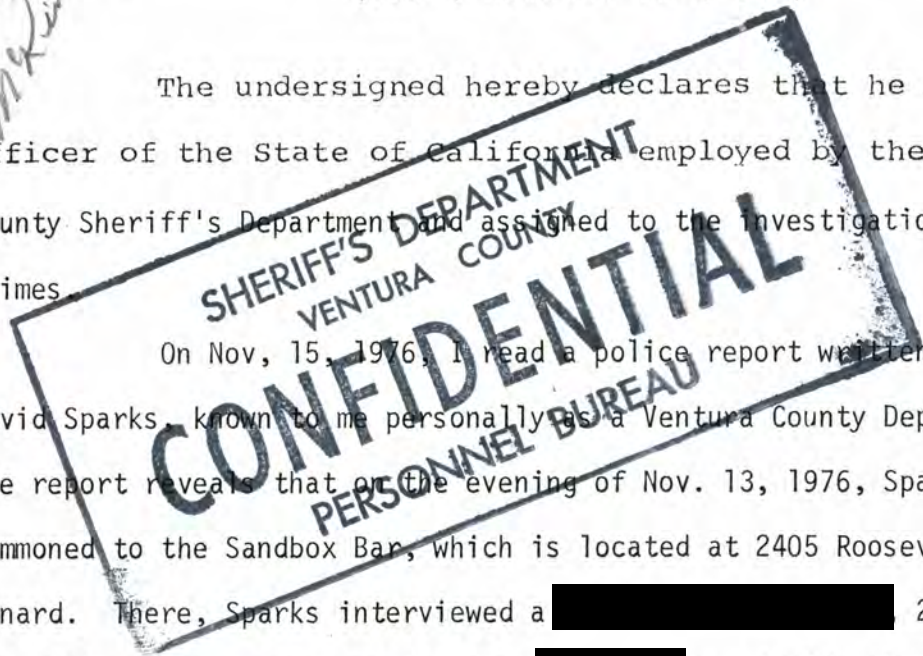

The undersigned hereby declares that he is a peace officer of the State of California employed by the Ventura County Sheriff's Department and assigned to the investigation of Major Crimes.

On Nov. 15, 1976, I read a police report written by David Sparks, known to me personally as a Ventura County Deputy Sheriff. The report reveals that on the evening of Nov. 13, 1976, Sparks was summoned to the Sandbox Bar, which is located at 2405 Roosevelt Blvd., Oxnard. There, Sparks interviewed a [redacted] 21 years, of Camarillo. The report reveals that [redacted] was inside the bar restroom. He was approached by an unknown male person who, after a short conversation, demanded money from [redacted]. The person had a pocket knife and, with the blade open, placed the point against [redacted] shirt. [redacted] gave the person his wallet which contained no money. The person returned the wallet and stated that he wanted the change in [redacted] pocket. [redacted] then reached into his pocket and gave the person his change, which was about eighty cents. [redacted] was then instructed not to tell anyone or he would be killed.

When the person left the bar, [redacted] told the bartender, [redacted] Oxnard, what had happened. The bartender knew the person [redacted] as a patron named Steve, who had been brought to the bar originally by a person named [redacted]. [redacted] entered the bar

shortly after the incident and revealed that "Steve" was a person known to him as Steve Drake, ^{TO SPARKS mm} WHO HAD RECENTLY BEEN IN COUNTY JAIL. ^{mm}

On Nov. 16, 1976, I received a photograph of William Steve Drake from Sheriff's Records. I included this photograph in a mug show-up folder, containing five other photographs. I showed [REDACTED] this folder, ^{mm} (EXHIBIT "A") - a COPY - admonishing him that the person responsible may or may not be included in the photographs, and that he was under no obligation to pick anyone.

[REDACTED] selected the photograph of Drake, saying "It looks like him without a beard". ^{mm} THIS PHOTOGRAPH WAS TAKEN IN JANUARY IN COUNTY JAIL; A MAY '76 COUNTY JAIL PHOTOGRAPH IS ATTACHED AS EXHIBIT "B" AND BOTH EXHIBITS () ARE INCORPORATED BY REFERENCE HEREIN. I attempted to locate Drake without success, but on Nov. 18,

1976, I received a phone call from a person who identified himself as Steve Drake. He said that he heard I was looking for him. I advised him that he was listed as a suspect in a robbery and asked him to come to the Sheriff's Office. He said he would be in later that day. Drake never came in and further efforts to locate him have been unsuccessful.

I request an arrest warrant be issued on William Steve Drake for 211a of the Penal Code.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct to the best of my information and belief. Dated 12/2/76 in Ventura, California.

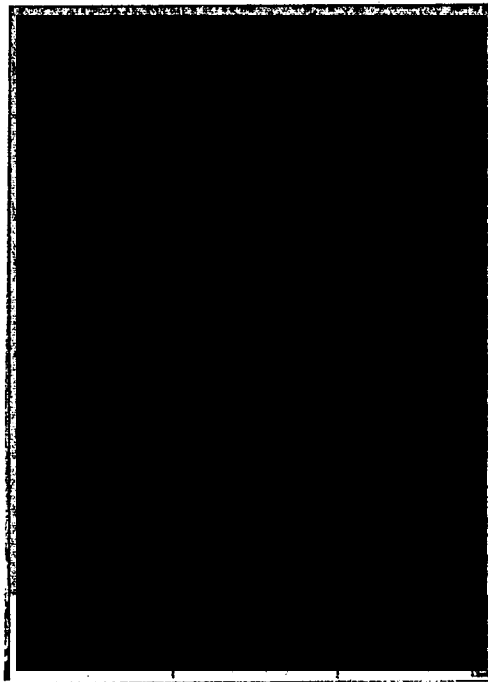
CRIME SUMMARY

On 12-10-76, 1530 hours, Deputies Thomas Odle and Noel Brown of the Ventura Sheriff's Department went to [REDACTED] Mockingbird Lane, Oxnard, for the purpose of serving an arrest warrant, charging a violation of Penal Code Section 211, on William Steven Drake, a resident of that address.

While arresting Drake, who had been located hiding in a bedroom closet, Drake obtained a knife and attempted to evade arrest by attacking the officers. Deputy Odle fired two rounds, striking the subject once in the chest.

William Steven Drake subsequently stabbed himself with the knife, after being shot by Deputy Odle. Drake died as a result of both wounds.

Investigation of the incident and a review of the facts surrounding the incident by the Ventura County District Attorney's Office concluded that the homicide was justifiable under Penal Code Sections 196.3, 197.1 and 197.3.

On 12-10-76, 1530 hrs, RP Thomas Darrell Odle and W Noel Thomas Brown proceeded to the above address for the purpose of serving an outstanding arrest warrant on the victim. After identifying themselves as peace officers and being admitted to the residence by the victims wife, [REDACTED], they located the victim hiding in a closet of the rear bedroom. On ordering the victim out of his place of concealment the victim ran to the bed where he obtained a knife from beneath the mattress and started toward above officers. Officers warned the subject to drop the knife and when he failed to comply, still approaching officers, RP Odle fired one round. At this time the subject retreated and then again started toward officers at which time RP Odle again fired one round. The subject then backed up to the wall of the bedroom, observed his wound, stated "thats not enough", and stabbed himself in the chest with the knife.

Following the incident, RP Odle attempted to provide emergency first-aid to the victim. The victim was pronounced dead by Fire Department personnel.

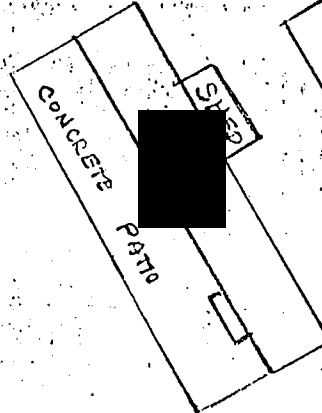

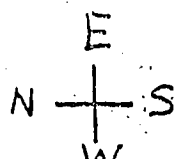

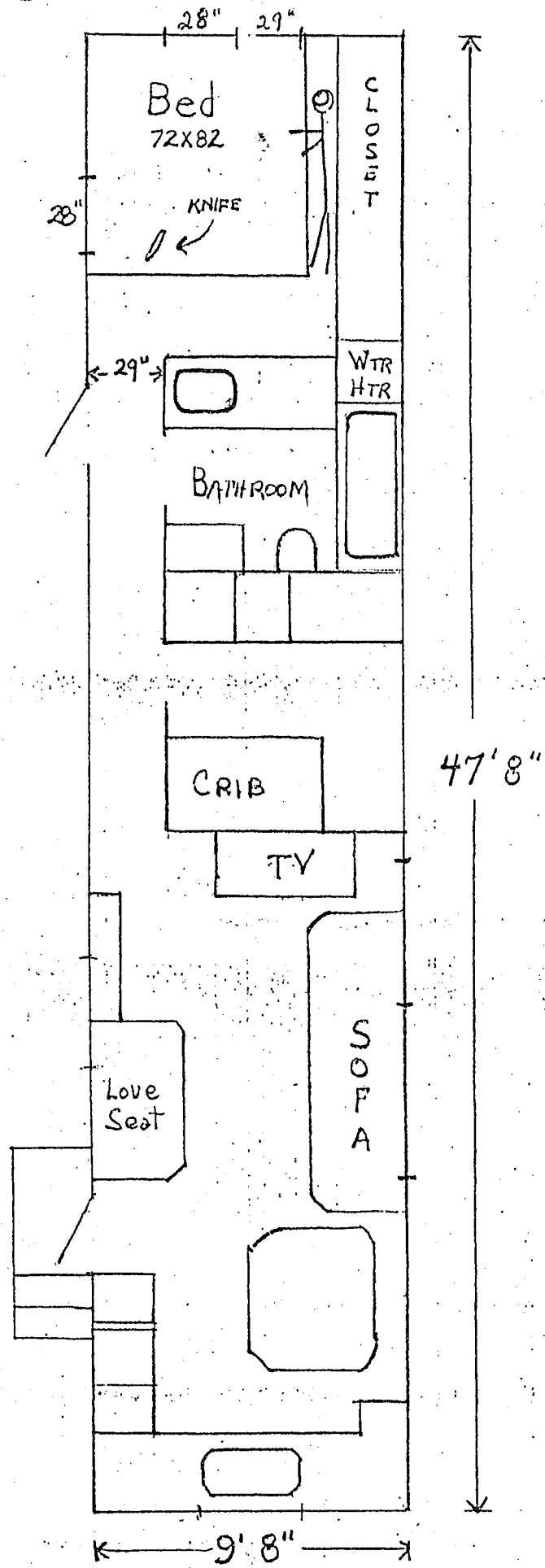

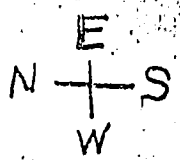

INVESTIGATION REPORT

12-10-76, 1530 hours, undersigned detective and Detective Pultz monitored a radio call of "gun shots inside trailer, law enforcement officer possibly involved", "two shots--three shots fired, law enforcement officer involved", and "Code 4, suspect deceased, coroner dispatched". At this time, the location of the scene was indicated to be at Mockingbird Lane, Oxnard. Further inquiries indicated this address was located inside the Sunny Acres Mobile Home Park, Pleasant Valley Road. At this time, undersigned detective requested that the Coroner's Office be advised to standby, rather than responding to the scene, until it could be ascertained if they would be needed immediately.

1535 hours, undersigned detective, accompanied by Detective Pultz, arrived at the scene. At this time, Oxnard Fire Department units also arrived and the following was noted. California Highway Patrol Officer Carfi had also responded to the scene and was at the door of the mobile home located at Mockingbird Lane. On entering the mobile home, Ventura Sheriff's Deputy Noel Brown was observed talking on the telephone in the kitchen area and a white female, in a hysterical state, was noted in the same room. Ventura Sheriff's Office Deputy T. Odle was

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observed exiting the hallway into the living room area. At this time, it was observed that Deputy Odle's hands were covered with blood.

Oxnard Fire Department personnel [REDACTED], Acting Captain, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] proceeded to the rear bedroom, where it was indicated the suspect was located. Undersigned detective accompanied the Fire Department personnel to the rear bedroom, where the suspect was observed lying on his right side, between the south side of the bed and the closet bordering the south wall of the bedroom. The head of the subject is to the east and the victim/suspect is clad in a brown/orange striped tee-shirt, (pulled up towards the chest), brown pants, no shoes or socks were present on the body. Bloodstains are noted on the chest and upper torso area. No life signs are present.

A bloodied butcher type kitchen knife, with an approximately eight inch blade and wooden handle, is noted at the foot of the bed, resting on the bed coverings.

Blood is noted on the east wall with a semi-distinguishable handprint appearing on the top portion of the stains approximately 40 inches off the floor.

The west door of the closet along the south wall of the bedroom is noted to be open.

Two bullet holes, one appearing to penetrate the paneling, approximately 32 inches from the floor level, is found to be a through and through shot, exiting the exterior wall of [REDACTED] Mockingbird Lane and reentering the west wall of [REDACTED] Cardinal Avenue, an adjacent trailer. The shot continues through the west wall of [REDACTED] Cardinal Avenue,

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traversing through the exterior and interior walls, penetrated the carpet and lodging in the sub-flooring.

The second bullet hole appears in the east window, south portion, and traverses through the screening, glass and aluminum awning covering the window. The bullet continued on a track to a point of impact at the top of the aluminum molding at the trailer located at [REDACTED] Cardinal Avenue.

Two expended 9 millimeter cartridge cases are located on the carpet of the floor to the north of the closet along the south wall at [REDACTED] Mockingbird Lane.

Position and trajectory of the bullet holes indicate the shots were fired from the west to east direction.

On arrival at the scene, Detective Pultz seized Deputy Odle's weapon and placed it into the locked trunk compartment of Oxnard Detective unit #1372. This weapon is noted to be a "Smith and Wesson" 9 millimeter, bearing serial number [REDACTED].

1605 hours, undersigned detective received Deputy Noel Brown's weapon, a "Smith and Wesson" 9 millimeter, serial number [REDACTED], and one 9 millimeter clip containing eight cartridges. At this time, undersigned detective also received one 9 millimeter clips containing eight cartridges from Deputy Odle. Both weapons were kept separated at all, with Deputy Odle's weapon being kept locked in the trunk of Detective unit #1372 at all times. Deputy Brown's weapon was placed in the locked trunk compartment of Officer Boyd's unit.

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1608 hours, in response to undersigned detective's request, Detective Lieutenant Hanline and Detective Sergeant Monahan responded to the scene and were briefed on known facts to date.

Ventura Sheriff's Office personnel, including Lieutenant Harrison, Commander Burchess Sergeant McCoy, Deputy Troxell and other plain clothed units had arrived at the scene.

1615 hours, in response to undersigned detective's request, Sergeant Elder and Police Service Officer Alvarez of the Oxnard Police Department Bureau of Identification Unit arrived at the scene. At this time, department representatives of Ventura Sheriff's Office and Oxnard Police Department met regarding the investigation of the case. At this time, it was decided that the Oxnard Police Department would have full control of the investigation. It was also decided, at this time, that Ventura Sheriff's Office Crime Laboratory would be used for analysis of any evidence.

Sergeant Elder was assigned to the scene reference evidence collection and photography. Processing was directed to start at [REDACTED] Cardinal Avenue to recover the expended bullet appearing to have come from the scene at [REDACTED] Mockingbird Lane. Detective Pultz was assigned to cover all interviews and witnesses at this time.

The indentations appearing to be bullet strike marks were located on the exterior of the residence at [REDACTED] Cardinal Avenue. The indentation appearing to be caused from the shot fired through the screen, glass and awning of [REDACTED] Mockingbird Lane was tested for blood residue with positive results by [REDACTED] of the Ventura Sheriff's Office Crime Laboratory.

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Ventura County Public Works Department was contacted and requested to respond for diagrams.

Officer Boyd was relieved at the scene by Officer Stofey, and at this time Ventura Sheriff's Office Deputy Noel Brown's weapon was transported from Officer Boyd's unit to Officer Stofey's unit by undersigned detective.

1620 hours, crime scene processing was begun at the [REDACTED] residence, [REDACTED] Cardinal Avenue, Oxnard, telephone [REDACTED]

The entire exterior and interior of this mobile home was processed and an expended bullet retrieved from the sub-flooring of the residence. This expended bullet was recovered from the point which ended the line of trajectory from [REDACTED] Mockingbird Lane.

1730 hours, entry into the crime scene was made by Sergeant Elder, Oxnard Police Department Bureau of Identification, Police Service Officer Alvarez, Oxnard Police Department Bureau of Identification, undersigned detective, Sergeant McCoy, Ventura Sheriff's Office, Detective Division, and [REDACTED], Ventura Sheriff's Office, Bureau of Identification. All areas inside the mobile home were photographed prior to entry by any of the above subjects.

The scene was processed by Oxnard Police Department personnel. For further information, refer reports by Sergeant Elder and Police Service Officer Alvarez.

1740 hours, undersigned detective was contacted by [REDACTED] of the Ventura

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County Public Works. At this time, Mr. [REDACTED] was advised of what would be required in the diagrams and the diagrams were started:

Prior to entry into the crime scene, undersigned detective was advised by Detective Pultz that statements from both Deputy Odle and Deputy Brown had been obtained. Statements from witnesses, [REDACTED] and other persons around the surrounding area, had been obtained. For further information, refer reports by Detective Pultz and Officer Esperanza, Oxnard Police Department.

Deputies Tom Odle and Noel Brown had been transported to the hospital for purposes of having blood samples drawn. The deputies were transported by Ventura Sheriff's Office personnel and met at the hospital by Oxnard Police Department Officer Alford. At this time, Officer Alford was assigned to observe the samples being drawn and to retain the samples, which were to be turned over for analysis.

On contacting Sergeant Elder, undersigned detective was advised that the samples obtained by the hospital had been turned over to Officer Alford, who in turn had turned them over to Sergeant Elder. At this time, they were turned over to Police Service Officer Melander, who transported same to Ventura Sheriff's Office Crime Laboratory for analysis.

Undersigned detective was advised by Detective Pultz that during the interview of Deputy Odle and Deputy Brown, Lieutenant Kalsbeck, Ventura Sheriff's Office, Internal Affairs, and Deputy District Attorney Mike Bradbury of the Ventura District Attorney's Office had also been present. For additional information regarding evidence collection,

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photographs, interviews and canvassing of witnesses, refer reports by Detective Pultz, Officer Boyd, Officer Esperanza, Sergeant Elder and Police Service Officer Alvarez.

2100 hours, the scene was secured by undersigned detective and Ventura Sheriff's Office Deputy McCoy. At this time, relatives of [REDACTED] were contacted and advised the scene was being secured and that officers were unable to lock the doors to the residence without a key. The parents of [REDACTED] indicated they would respond to the scene to take over the possession of the residence. At this time, undersigned detective also indicated to the parents of [REDACTED] that items requested by her for the care of her baby, including a brown leather woman's purse and contents, one key ring with four keys, one diaper bag and contents and one one-half gallon of milk, had been released per her request and a signed receipt taken.

Officer K. Dellinger responded to the scene and was advised to maintain security at the scene until the arrival of the [REDACTED] relatives.

2148 hours, undersigned detective was advised by Officer Dellinger that the scene was released to the [REDACTED] relatives.

2150 hours, Detective Pultz informed undersigned detective that he had been contacted by a [REDACTED] who had called on behalf of [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] Avenue, Oakland, telephone [REDACTED]. Mrs. [REDACTED] identified herself as the foster mother of William Steven Drake. At this time [REDACTED] was advised regarding the shooting and the death of the step-son. In response [REDACTED] stated that they had known victim had outstanding warrants for unknown charges, but could offer no further

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information. For further information regarding these warrants, refer original copies contained in this book.

Ventura Sheriff's Office Records regarding the original complaints, crime reports, and warrants were requested by undersigned detectives. At this time, the release of these documents was authorized and the documents were obtained by Officer Boyd on 12-11-76. For further information, refer supplementary report by Officer Boyd.

Following the interviews of concerned parties, Deputy District Attorney Mike Bradbury, who reviewed the case and monitored the interviews, indicated, in his opinion, the case was a justifiable homicide under sections 196.3, 197.1 and 197.3 of the Penal Code and drafted a memorandum to that effect to Lieutenant Hanline.

12-11-76, 1000 hours, Detective Pultz, Sergeant Elder and Police Service Officer Alvarez responded to the Ventura County General Hospital Morgue for the purposes of the autopsy of William Steven Drake to be performed at that location. For further information regarding this autopsy, refer Autopsy Report by Detective Pultz.

1400 hours, undersigned detective was contacted by Detective Pultz, who indicated the results of the autopsy showed that both wounds were fatal. Detective Pultz also indicated that wound #1, the bullet wound, was a through and through wound with an entry point above the left nipple of the chest and traversing across the body, exiting at the rear right shoulder. Wound #2 was a knife puncture wound to the upper left chest, slightly above wound #1.

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12-13-76, 0850 hours, both weapons (Odle's and Brown's) were released to Sergeant Elder from undersigned detective for processing.

All evidence was transported to the Ventura Sheriff's Office Crime Laboratory for analysis.

1055 hours, undersigned detective was contacted by a white male, who identified himself as [REDACTED] brother of the victim. At this time, undersigned detective was advised that he had spoken to representatives of the Ventura Sheriff's Office and that he wished to review copies of the reports. At this time, [REDACTED] was advised that no reports could be released or reviewed without Court Orders.

During the conversation with [REDACTED] undersigned detective was advised by Mr. [REDACTED] that according to the facts known to him, he felt that the officers "had probable cause" and that he just wanted to ascertain what had actually occurred.

The interview, which was not tape recorded, was concluded at 1110 hours.

Detective Lieutenant Hanline was advised of the investigation to date.

12-14-76, 1200 hours, undersigned detective received requested equipment issue inventory sheets on Deputy Odle and Deputy Brown from Ventura Sheriff's Office Administration and Personnel Division. These records indicated that Deputy Odle was issued a "Smith and Wesson" 9 millimeter weapon, serial number [REDACTED] and that Deputy Brown had been issued a "Smith and Wesson" 9 millimeter weapon, Model 939-2, serial number [REDACTED]

 On Friday, 12-10-76, about 1615 hours, reporting officer arrived pursuant to a call at the crime scene at Mockingbird Lane, Oxnard, Sunnyacres Trailer Park. Reporting officer was briefed by Detective Lieutenant Don Hanline and Detective Don Elliott regarding the situation. At about 1625 hours the trailer of Mrs. Cardinal Lane, phone was entered by reporting officer. A bullet apparently fired in the bedroom of the victim's trailer at Mockingbird exited the east wall and entered the left wall of Mrs. trailer which is directly east and perpendicular to the victim's trailer. The bullet passed through the outer wall and the interior paneling and lodged in the carpeting about 28" diagonally from the wall. The entry hole was approximately 3½" above the floor and 4" below the light socket on the wall near the bullet hole. The carpeting was cut open and the bullet was retrieved by reporting officer, tagged, marked, and placed in evidence locker. Photographs of both the interior of Mrs. trailer and the exterior were taken by reporting officer and Officer Alvarez. The second projectile, apparently the one that struck the victim, was fired through the window on the east end of the victim's trailer and upward through an aluminum awning over the window and struck a metal plate near the top portion of Mrs. trailer. A presumptive blood test was done at the indentation of Mrs. trailer and the test was positive. This test was done by Mr. Criminalist, Ventura Sheriff's Department Laboratory.

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This projectile could not be located in the grass area between the two trailers. A very thorough search was conducted still yielding negative results.

At 1730 hours the victim's trailer was entered by reporting officer and photographs were taken of the trailer from the west end to the east end until the body was located. The body was observed lying with the head in an easterly direction toward the east wall of the trailer between the bed and the closet doors. The east wall of the trailer had several blood spots where apparently the victim fell against the wall prior to falling to the floor. A butcher knife was located on the bed near the doorway from the hall adjoining the bedroom. The blade of the knife was approximately 8" long and both sides of the knife blade were covered with blood. The appearance of the blood and the formations of same on the knife appeared that the victim had stabbed himself at least 7" of the 8" blade of the knife. The entire scene was examined by reporting officer with assistance from Deputy Jim O'Neil, Ventura Sheriff's Department, and Chief Criminologist [REDACTED] Ventura Sheriff's Crime Laboratory. Reporting officer checked the underside of the mattress where allegedly the victim had removed the knife in an attempt to attack the entering Deputies. No compression was observed in the lower box spring or upper mattress area of the bed indicating that a knife was in that location. This cannot, however, preclude that a knife was placed in that location or perhaps the handle was protruding to such a point that it was easily grasped. The bedding and blankets were all removed from the bed much of them contained blood spots and several of the blankets revealed different types of trauma. The blankets will be examined by the laboratory for any possible bullet holes and/or basic blood typing.

Once the blankets were removed, the upper mattress was lifted up and a small blood spot was located on the top of the box spring area. This section was checked for presumptive tests of blood and the test was positive. A small section was cut from

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the mattress area, packaged and taken into evidence. The entire bed was then moved up against the wall and the victim's body was laid out. Officers observed what appeared to be a bullet hole and a knife hole in the upper left chest area approximately 3/4" apart. The victim's orange and brown tee shirt was completely blood soaked as was the crotch area of the victim's levis. Blood was also coming out of the victim's mouth and a considerable amount of blood was on the floor. The entire room was searched and photographed. All of the clothing in drawers and in the closet were removed and all the walls and ceilings and floor were thoroughly checked for any additional bullet holes and only the two previously described holes could be located. In searching the room two 9mm empty cartridges were located in the southwest corner of the bedroom near the closet door area. Deputy O'Neil located a pill bottle containing several pills and some hand rolled cigarettes under a banner located on the west wall of the bedroom. The body was examined by Doctor Duncan of the Coroner's Office at the scene. Reporting officer took into evidence a pair of white socks with blood on same and also took two blood swabs of the west wall of the trailer, i.e. the smears apparently caused by the victim's fall. Evidence items 1 through 14 were taken from the crime scene by reporting officer and transported to the police station for later processing. Each room in the victim's trailer was photographed along with the exterior of the trailer and the surrounding neighborhood. At the station the knife was processed for latent fingerprints with negative results. Later at the station reporting officer received two blood samples from the Detectives involved in the incident from Officer Alford. Blood samples were apparently obtained at the hospital and transported back to the Oxnard Police Department evidence refrigerator.

On Saturday, 12-11-76, reporting officer and Detective Pultz along with representatives from the Sheriff's Department attended the autopsy of the victim at the General Hospital Morgue. The autopsy was performed by Dr. [REDACTED] At 1010 hours

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Dr. [REDACTED] broke the seal of the refrigerated vault and removed the victim's body.

The victim's body was photographed in the same condition in which it was transported from the crime scene by the County-Wide Mortuary Service. The victim's clothing were removed from the body and transported later back to the Oxnard Police Department evidence room for drying, tagging and packaging. The victim was photographed in all stages of the autopsy including the fatal stab wounds and any other injuries and trauma to the body. Reporting officer clipped the fingernails off the victim's hands and retained them in evidence and also fingerprinted the victim. The fingerprint cards were transported along with the fingernails and evidence items 18 through 23 inclusive back to the Oxnard Police Department. The fingerprints will be compared with fingerprints on file for positive identity of the deceased.

At the station the following belongings were taken from the victim's trousers.

- a. A booklet of service station coupons.
- b. A black comb.
- c. Fingernail clippers.
- d. A Greyhound bus ticket.

Service weapons of both Detectives were retained in evidence by Detectives Pultz and Elliott of the Oxnard Police Department. Detective Odle's weapon was taken by Detective Pultz and Detective Brown's taken by Detective Elliott. These weapons were photographed along with the amount of cartridges in the gun and in the attached clip and likewise both guns were photographed. A total of 10 rolls of Kodacolor II, 35mm film were taken and this along with evidence items 1 through 22 were transported to the Ventura Sheriff's Department Laboratory on 12-13-76 by Property Custodian [REDACTED]. For additional information refer to crime scene sketch, evidence list and follow-up report by Officer Alvarez. There is no further information available at this time.

On Tuesday 12-14-76 at 1400 hours reporting officer compared the fingerprints of the deceased with a fingerprint card in the files of the Sheriff's Department under the name William Steven Drake, Sheriff's B.I.# [REDACTED]. The prints are identical.

 On my arrival at Mockingbird, Detective Elliott explained the circumstances and the scene. Our first effort was directed at recovering the slug that had passed through Mockingbird and into Cardinal. I took photos of the entry hole at then moved inside to photograph the removal of the slug from the floor beneath the carpet by Sergeant Elder. I then took photos of the east end of to show the exit from there of the aforementioned slug.

Back up photos of Sergeant Elder's entry into of locking mechanism of the western most door, and interior photos of each room and its contents were also taken by me. The victim was in the east bedroom lying between the south edge of the bed and the closet with his head to the east. A knife could be seen on the west end of the bed along with prominent blood spots on the southeast corner of the bed as well as the wall between the bed and the closet. A hole resembling that possibly made by a bullet could be seen on the wall near that corner of the bed.

Earlier a bullet hole had been found in the east window of The bullet had passed through the window and its aluminum awning striking at the upper edge of its north west window near the upper left corner (second rivet from the left end). This bullet

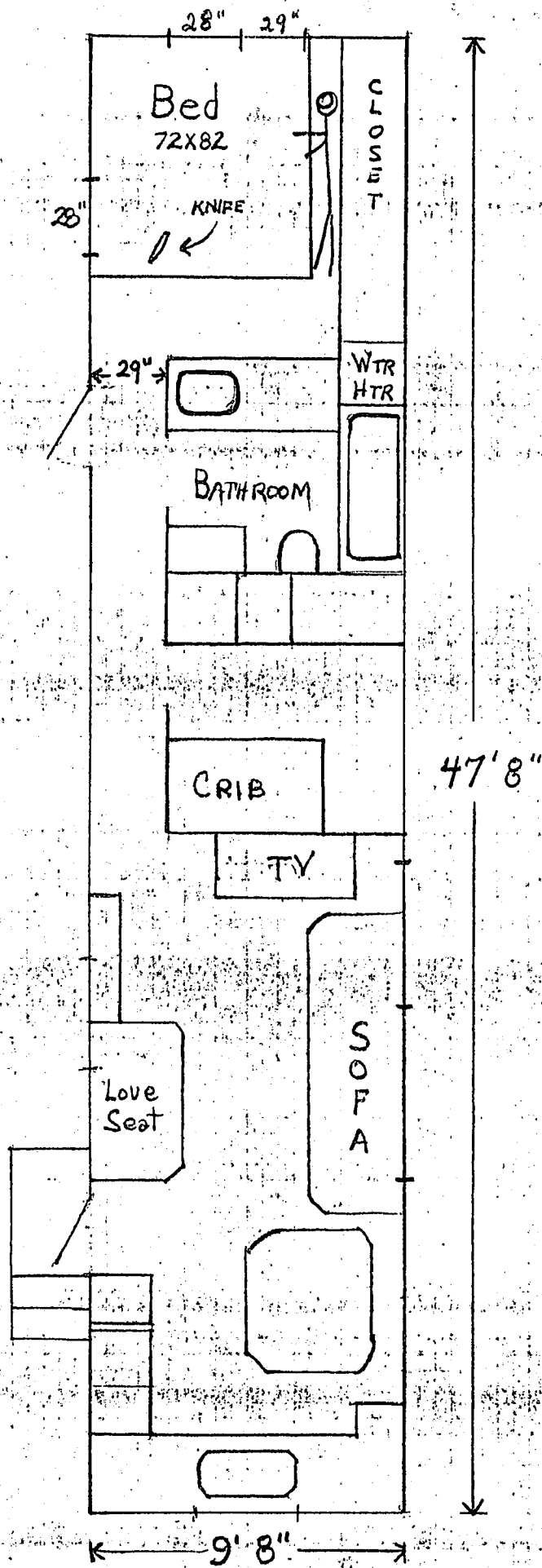

At 0915 hours I reported to the station to prepare for a search for the missing slug. I went to Ventura County General Hospital to receive the metal detector from the Sheriff's office. On receiving this I returned to Oxnard but was then recalled to Ventura to deliver the knife involved in the shooting/stabbing. After delivering the knife I arrived at the crime scene at about 1145 and began to search for the slug with the metal detector. The area to be searched was the grass area between Cardinal and Mockingbird. Officer Harold Lewis who was assisting had been informed by a neighbor that the area had just been mowed earlier and that the grass clippings were in a nearby trash can. The metal detector was ineffectual within 14 inches of the metal trailer and detected only two metal items which were recovered from 4 - 6 inches below the surface (a penny and a metal 2" X 2" plate) -the grass area for several feet to each side of the westernmost window was hand searched on hands and knees with negative results. The grass clippings were also searched with the metal detector and hands with negative results. The search was concluded at about 1330 hours.

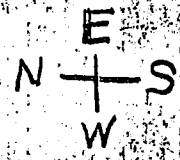

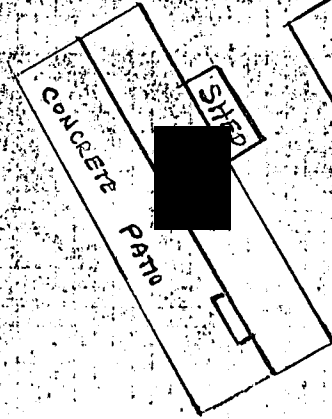

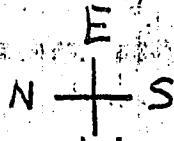

On 12-10-76, at 1700 hours, a female identified as [redacted] wife of William Steven Drake, was interviewed in the East Detective Office of the Oxnard Police Department by Detective Pultz and Detective Troxell, Ventura Sheriff's Office. Present during a portion of the interview was [redacted] sister, [redacted] 23 years, [redacted] Oxnard, telephone [redacted]. The reason for Mrs. [redacted] presence was to attempt to calm Mrs. [redacted] down, as she was extremely upset and crying. While undersigned and Detective Troxell were transporting Mrs. [redacted] to the station for an interview, a tape recorder was allowed to run. Her statement while enroute and her interview is incorporated in this interview report.

In response to questions, Mrs. [redacted] related that her husband, William Steven Drake, had been at the residence for approximately one week and had intended on spending the Christmas Season with her. She arrived at her residence on 12-10-76 and Steve was sitting on the couch and she was sitting beside him. At that time, two men came to the door, who identified themselves as being Sheriff's officers and wanted to know if Steve was there. She stated that she

asked why they wanted Steve and they indicated that a couple of weeks ago Steve put a knife to "some guy" and robbed him of 70 cents. She indicated that they asked permission to enter and to search for Drake; however, she told them that she didn't want them to come inside her residence. She indicated that they told her that they weren't going to look for drugs, but she still did not want them to come into her residence. This conversation took place on the front porch of the trailer.

After a brief conversation, she opened the door to the residence and allowed them to enter. Once inside, they began searching the residence, going into the baby's room and the bathroom. The officers walked into the back bedroom and she followed. She stated that she was in the hallway and then moved into the bedroom behind the two officers. She stated that one of the officers opened the closet door on the southwest corner of the bedroom and she saw Steve crouched down inside the closet. They ordered him to come out of the closet, and at that time both officers had their guns drawn.

She stated that Steve stated, as he was standing up, that he didn't want to go back. When asked what he meant by that, she indicated "Jail". After Drake exited the closet, [REDACTED] stated that both officers shot him, first one and then the other. When asked what direction, she indicated a southerly direction, as Steve was standing in front of the closet.

After he was shot, he walked over to the corner of the mattress, picked up same, and took out a knife, she described as being one of her butcher knives from the kitchen; however, she stated that she did not know that he had the knife underneath the mattress. After Drake had the knife in his possession, he told the officers to stay away from there

because he was going to stab himself. He stated that he would do it because he didn't ever want to go back there again. She stated that she didn't know what happened after this because she was told to leave the room, and she did so to call for police or ambulance. When she returned, she observed her husband lying on the floor. She stated that Mr. Drake did not have anything in his hands when he was shot. She also stated several times that both officers fired, and that the direction of fire was a southerly direction, while he was in front of the closet.

As to her previous conversation with the officers, while on the front porch outside the residence, she indicated that they had a warrant for Steve, but she stated that she did not see the warrant. She also stated that she should not have opened the door, that she should have made believe that nobody was home and then this incident wouldn't have happened.

Mrs. [REDACTED] was asked to draw a diagram of the room in which the shooting took place, but due to her being upset, she was unable to do so. Undersigned detective made a drawing of the room and indicated from information received from [REDACTED] where the closets and bed were located, and then Mrs. [REDACTED] was asked to put an "X" where the officers and she were standing. She could not accomplish this. She was asked to point and undersigned detective would make an "X" where she had placed her finger. She indicated on the sketch that one officer was standing in front of the closet on the southwest corner of the bedroom; the other officer was standing to the left and rear of the position of the first officer. According to the place that Mrs. [REDACTED] pointed, it would mean the second officer was on the west side of the bed, almost at the southwest corner. Her location was several feet behind the second officer and next to the bed

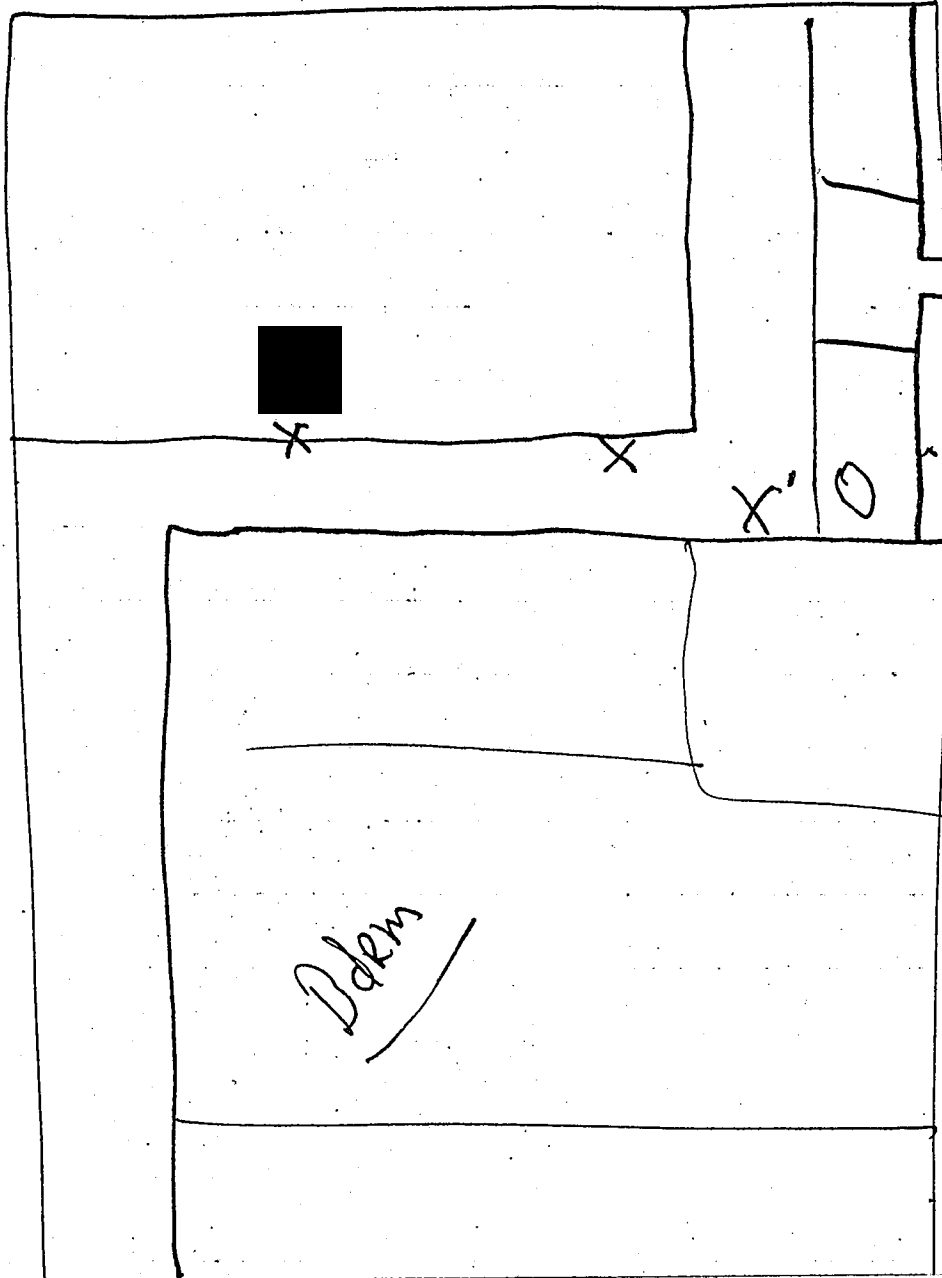

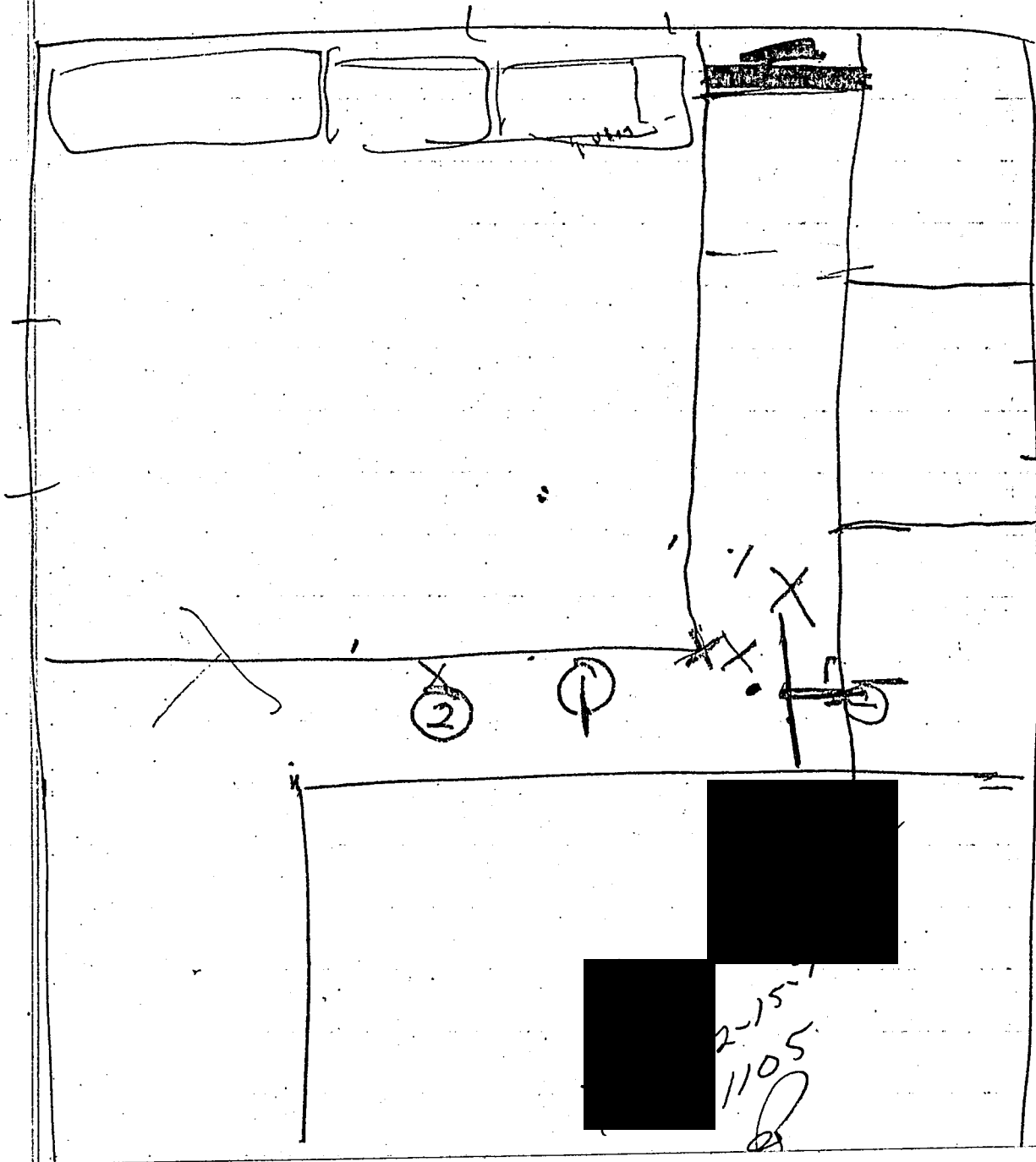
12-15-76, 1005 hours, [REDACTED] came to the Oxnard Police Department at her own request, in order to give an additional statement concerning the chain of events occurring on 12-10-76 at her residence on Mockingbird Lane, Oxnard. She was interviewed in the Detective Commander's Office by Lieutenant Hanline and Detective Pultz.

During the interview, she reiterated basically the same information that she had given on the night of the incident. She was asked to draw a sketch of the room in which the shooting took place and mark her location and the locations of the officers. The locations were changed slightly from her previous diagram, now being more in a south-westerly direction towards the front of the southwest closet.

She indicated that her husband, Mr. Drake, stepped out of the closet approximately one short step, when he was shot. She again stated she heard two shots. She again stated several times that her husband did not have a knife in his possession and was not advancing towards officers prior to the shooting. She stated that after the shooting he ran to the corner of the mattress, raised same, and obtained the knife and then immediately put it to his chest as he was leaning against the wall. She indicated that she saw the shooting, but did not see him stab himself.

The diagram that she drew on 12-15-76 was signed, dated and timed and countersigned by undersigned detective. The interview on 12-15-76 was not recorded.

THOMAS ODLE INTERVIEW REPORT

On 12-10-76, at 1850 hours, a person identifying himself as Thomas Odle was interviewed in the East Detective Office of the Oxnard Police Department by Detective Pultz and Detective Troxell, Ventura Sheriff's Office. Present were Lieutenant L. Kalsbeck, Ventura Sheriff's Office, and Assistant District Attorney Michael Bradbury. Detective Odle was interviewed as to the chain of events which took place earlier at Mockingbird Lane, Oxnard. Odle related the following.

At approximately 1520 hours, date, he and Detective Noel Brown arrived at Mockingbird Lane, Oxnard. They had a warrant for section 211 of the Penal Code for a subject by the name of William Steven Drake of Mockingbird Lane, Oxnard. Detective Odle stated that he parked their vehicle approximately two trailers down, and as he was parking same, he observed a blonde headed female look out of the end (west) window of the trailer. After he got out of the vehicle, they walked up to the door and knocked. At that time, he was standing down on the ground, just below the porch. At that time, a person later identified as Mrs. exited the trailer and stood on the porch. He identified himself as being from the Sheriff's Department and asked if Steven Drake was there. She said no. Odle stated that he asked for permission to search the trailer.

and she replied by asking if he had a search warrant. Odle stated he replied "No, we have a warrant of arrest". He stated that if he had reasonable cause to believe that he was in there, he didn't need permission, but would like to have her permission to search the trailer. She stated "Then you mean you could go in anyway". Odle replied "If I feel strong enough that he is in there, yes". At that time, Mrs. [REDACTED] stated "No" to his entry. Again, Odle replied that he really didn't need her permission, but would like to go in and search. She stated "Well, if you're going to anyway, go ahead".

At that time, Detective Odle was asked by undersigned why he went to that location looking for Drake. He indicated that was the address listed on the front of the warrant and because Mrs. [REDACTED] came outside and appeared nervous and because of her actions Odle had a feeling that William Steven Drake was probably inside the trailer. Detective Odle told Mrs. [REDACTED] that they only wanted to look for William Drake and nothing else, thinking she might be trying to cover up for other contraband. He indicated that she finally consented and allowed officers to enter the residence.

Detective Odle stated that after entry into the residence, Mrs. [REDACTED] walked to the rear bedroom and then returned to the living room. At that time, the officers began a search of the residence. Odle stated that they looked through the living room and then proceeded down the hallway into another bedroom, which appeared to them to be a baby's room. They then searched a bathroom and then proceeded into the bedroom on the east end of the trailer. Upon entering the bedroom, Detective Odle observed closets with two doors, one door on the southeast corner and one on the southwest of the bedroom. Odle stated that he approached the closet door on the southwest corner and had his hand on his weapon. He slid the door open and observed subject Drake crouched down in the

closet. Odle stated he drew his weapon and ordered Drake to come out of the closet. Drake stood up and walked out of the closet, at which time Odle ordered Drake to move to the wall to his (Drake's) right at the east end of the trailer and place his hands on the wall. Drake moved in that direction, and when he got to the edge of the bed, which was approximately 18 inches from the closet, Drake reached down, pulled the mattress up and withdrew a knife.

Holding the knife in an overhand raised position, right hand, he began approaching the officers. Odle stated that he fired one shot, and Drake stopped and then started towards the officers again, with the knife still raised. Odle estimated the distance was approximately four feet between him and Drake. Odle fired one more time, and then Drake went back against the wall, stood there with the knife still in his hand. Both he and Brown ordered Drake to drop the knife and Drake refused. They again ordered him to drop the knife and he still refused. At that time, Drake stated "Get out, let me think about it". They replied "No" and repeatedly asked him to drop the knife. Drake refused. At that time, Drake got into a crouched position and put the knife to his chest and pulled inward. Odle stated he moved towards him in an attempt to stop him, but couldn't. Odle grabbed Drake's hand, which was around the knife, and they both pulled the knife out. At that time, Odle had possession of the knife, which he threw on the bed out of Drake's reach. At that time, Odle pulled on Drake's feet and stretched him out prone on the floor and attempted first aid.

At this point in the interview, undersigned detective requested Detective Odle to draw a sketch of the trailer and room in which the shooting took place. In the sketch Odle indicated that Detective Brown was standing behind him in the location on the south-

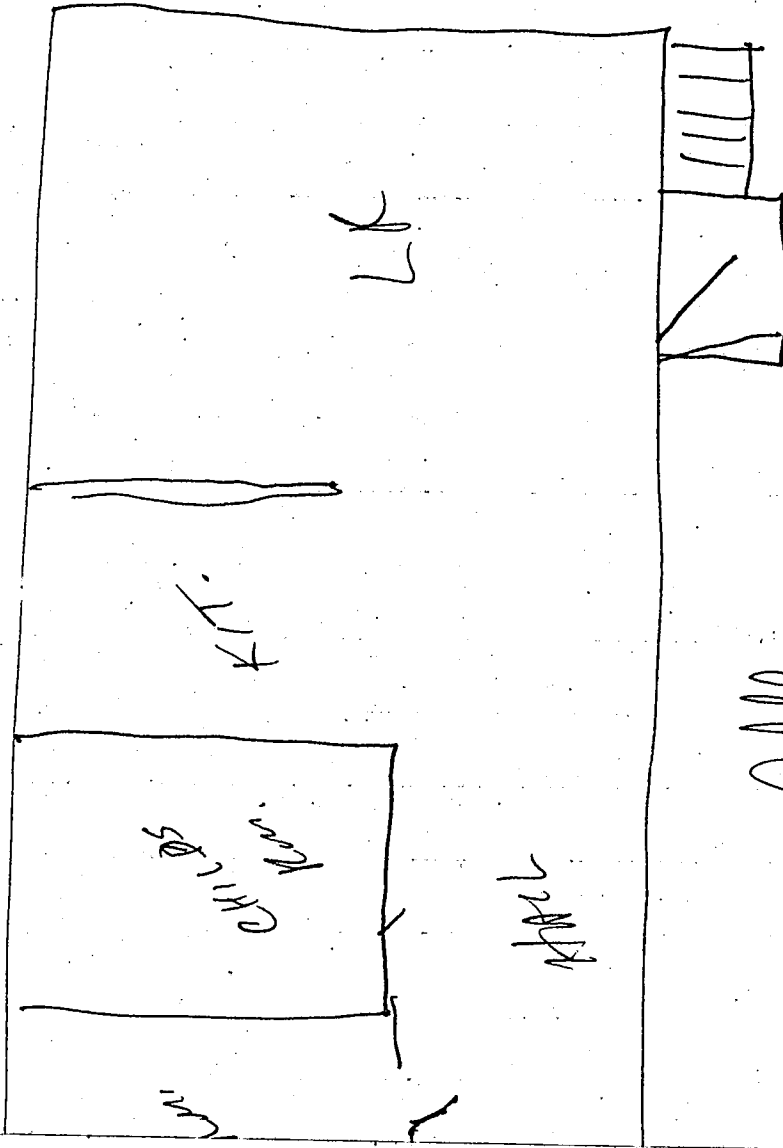

west corner of the closet in which the suspect/victim was located, also the direction in which the suspect/victim walked (eastbound) and the direction of his firing. Detective Odle stated that his shots were fired in an easterly direction. Detective Odle indicated that because Detective Brown was standing behind, he does not know at which point Detective Brown drew his weapon. He didn't know if Mrs. [REDACTED] was in the bedroom at the time of the shooting.

After the shooting, while the victim was still standing and prior to stabbing himself, he stated "Go ahead, kill me". At that time, Mrs. [REDACTED] was screaming that they had shot her husband. Odle told Mrs. [REDACTED] to call the police and ambulance. As she turned, Drake pulled the knife into his chest. At that time, Detective Brown left the residence to use the police radio to obtain assistance and Odle remained at the victim's location, attempting first aid until the Fire Department arrived. Odle estimated 15 to 25 seconds from the time he opened the closet door to the time he fired the second shot.

NOEL BROWN INTERVIEW REPORT

On 12-10-76, at 1915 hours, a person identifying himself as a 32 year old male, Noel Thomas Brown, a Deputy Sheriff, was interviewed in the East Detective Office of the Oxnard Police Department by Detective Pultz and Detective Troxell, Ventura Sheriff's Office. Present were Lieutenant L. Kalsbeck, Ventura Sheriff's Office, and Assistant District Attorney Michael Bradbury. Detective Brown was interviewed as to the chain of events which took place earlier at Mockingbird Lane, Oxnard. Detective Brown related the following information..

He and Detective Odle went to the Mockingbird Lane address to serve a warrant for section 211 of the Penal Code. They pulled their vehicle up to within one trailer away from the Drake residence, and as they did so, they saw the curtains back and a hand at the window. Detective Odle mentioned to him that they had just picked out at them. Brown indicated that they proceeded up to the residence and knocked at the door. A female, later identified as Mrs. [redacted], answered the door. She asked what they wanted and they identified themselves and wanted to know if William Steven Drake was there. She replied "No". At that time, Detective Brown stated that she exited the residence and stood on the porch and closed the door behind her, stating "I gotta

keep the door shut" and pointed back to her baby. Again, they asked if William Drake was there and she again stated "No", and stated she "hadn't seen him in three weeks". They then asked if she knew where he was and she again replied "No".

Detective Brown stated that at that time, Mrs. [REDACTED] was acting "pretty henky" and that he thought that Drake was probably inside the residence. Detective Odle asked her if they could go in and look around and she replied that she didn't like people going into her residence. They advised that they had an arrest warrant and she asked if they also had a search warrant. Detective Odle said that they had a warrant for his arrest and had the authority to go in if they thought that he was inside. Detective Brown stated that they were not looking for any "dope" and they weren't going to go into any drawers, they just wanted to look in places where a body might be hiding. She said "Well, I don't know". Detective Odle again told her that they had the authority to go in, and she said "Well, if you can do it anyway, I guess so". At that time, she opened the door and allowed officers to enter.

They began looking through the residence, beginning in the area of the kitchen and living room. Detective Odle was in front of Detective Brown and Odle proceeded down the hallway, looked into each of the rooms, and Brown followed. Detective Odle then entered the bedroom on the east end of the trailer with Brown still following. Detective Brown described this room as being small and containing a king size bed, and this left little space for walking. Due to the small area, Detective Brown stayed in the doorway and Odle went to the south side of the bed, where two closets were located, doors being on the east and west end of the closet. Detective Odle opened the door on the west end and Brown observed Drake crouched down in the closet. Odle was in front of him. Detective

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Odle stepped back, and at that time had his weapon pointed at Drake and told him to come out of the closet and get his hands up where he could see them. He told him to get over next to the wall and put his hands up on the wall.

At that time, Drake exited the closet and took one step east and then took one more step to the edge of the bed and pulled up the mattress. Detective Brown stated that he presumed that Drake was going for a gun. At that time, Brown withdrew his weapon. By the time Detective Brown got his weapon unholstered, Drake had pulled a knife and was holding it in his right hand. The knife was in a raised, overhand position, raised to approximately the ear level. Drake took a step towards Detective Odle. Odle fired one shot and Detective Brown stated that he squeezed the trigger on his own weapon, but due to the safety being on, it did not fire. Odle fired a second shot. Drake had stopped and stood there with the knife in his hand. Detectives Brown and Odle were yelling at him to drop the knife. His wife was in the hallway behind Brown attempting to enter the room and Brown was attempting to keep her out. Brown stated that she was screaming and Brown told her to go get an ambulance. Drake was still standing at that time, and they were telling him to drop the knife or they would shoot. Drake said "Go ahead and shoot me, kill me". They again advised him to drop the knife and Drake said "Well, let me think about it". They told him to drop it now and Drake replied "Well, I'm not going back" and took the knife and put it to his chest.

Detective Odle attempted to move towards Drake, but he (Drake) pulled the knife to his chest. Detective Odle grabbed the knife and it was extracted by either Drake, Odle or both and thrown on the bed. At that time, Drake went into a crouched position and fell over on the floor between the bed and wall. Detective Brown stated that Odle

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attempted to stop the bleeding, while Brown went out to his police unit to call for an ambulance.

At that time, a diagram of the trailer was drawn for clarification. Detective Brown said that there was no room for movement, so he was standing in the doorway with Mrs. [REDACTED] behind him, he thought approximately eight to nine feet from Detective Odle. After Drake exited the closet and went eastbound, Brown moved approximately one foot in a southerly direction into the bedroom.

Prior to the shot, he thinks Detective Odle said "Don't do it". After Detective Odle fired, Mrs. [REDACTED] grabbed Detective Brown's shoulder attempting to enter the bedroom. This confrontation took place in the hallway. After Drake was shot and went down, Mrs. [REDACTED] entered the bedroom approximately two feet past the hallway. When asked if he felt that Mrs. [REDACTED] was in the room far enough and had a view of the closet in which Drake was hiding, he stated yes, because when Odle opened the closet door, he heard Mrs. [REDACTED] say "Oh no".

As to the question of distance between Odle and Drake when Drake first grabbed the knife, Detective Brown estimated the distance between five to six feet maximum. The shots were in rapid succession and fired in a predominantly eastern direction. After the second shot was fired, Detective Brown observed Drake pick up his shirt and look at his wound, and then drop his shirt down.

He further stated that Mrs. [REDACTED] might have possibly observed the shooting, but didn't observe the stabbing, because she had gone into the kitchen area to use the

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telephone to call for an ambulance. In the meantime, Drake had stabbed himself. When she returned, she said "Is he dead, what happened?". Detective Brown stated that he told her that he took the knife and cut himself with it.

Detective Brown estimated the time that he was found in the closet until after he was lying on the floor was approximately 30 seconds.

husband by name. She then heard Mrs. [REDACTED] say "Are you allowed to search with just that or do you have to have a warrant?" She heard Mrs. [REDACTED] tell them that they would have to have a warrant before they could search the house. At that time, she heard the officers say if they believed that he was in there, they could go in and search anyway. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated "Go get a warrant first". The officers stated again that if they believed that he was in there, they could go in and search without a warrant. Mrs. [REDACTED] then stated "Come on in". At that time, Mrs. [REDACTED] opened the door and entered the residence, followed by [REDACTED] and the two officers. [REDACTED] indicated that she did not know which officer entered first, but that the one in the green checked suit (Brown) entered the residence last. Upon her [REDACTED] entry, she walked to the couch area in the living room (location of the Drake baby at that time). Mrs. [REDACTED] was walking down the hallway, as was one officer. The other officer was already in the back bedroom.

The officer wearing the green checked suit (Brown) stood in the doorway, and the other officer (Odle) entered the bedroom. From [REDACTED] position, she could see down the hallway. [REDACTED] stated that at that time, she heard [REDACTED] (Mrs. [REDACTED] scream "No Steve, don't do it". Then he (victim) said "I don't care if I go to jail". At that time, [REDACTED] said that she heard three shots. With that statement, Mrs. [REDACTED] mother, who was present during the interview, stated that she was in her [REDACTED] front yard, approximately 150 to 200 feet north of the [REDACTED] residence. She also heard three shots, but felt that it was a car backfiring. [REDACTED] stated that after hearing the shots, she picked up [REDACTED] (baby) and ran out of the trailer and over to a neighbor's residence.

AUTOPSY REPORT

On 12-11-76, at 1015 hours, a postmortem examination was begun on William S. Drake at the Ventura County Morgue by Dr. [REDACTED]. Present were [REDACTED] Sergeant Elder, Oxnard Police Department, Bureau of Identification, Detective G. Pultz, Sergeant M. McCoy, Detective L. Troxell, Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Deputy Story, Ventura County Sheriff's Office, Bureau of Identification, and [REDACTED] Ventura County Sheriff's Office Laboratory.

The body was clothed in a brown and orange striped tee-shirt and brown corduroy trousers. He was barefoot. Paper bags had been placed and tied over both hands. The shirt was pulled up, exposing the stomach and right nipple. There were two holes observed in the shirt at the left breast pocket. The top hole was caused by the knife, with the dull margin towards the center of the body and the sharp edge angling slightly downward. The hole caused by the bullet was approximately one inch below the knife hole. Another hole was observed in the right rear shoulder area several inches below the top of the shoulder. There was blood around the mouth and nose and back to the right side of the head. There was dried blood on the shirt, chest and trousers.

The victim had several tattoos on his arms and hand. A cutting wound, one-half inch long, was

observed over the second knuckle of the left index finger. There was a healing abrasion on the right leg, just below the knee. The victim had dried blood spots on the bottom portion of both feet.

The knife wound was 16-1/2 inches from the top of the head. The dull margin began approximately three inches to the left of midline, angling downward approximately one-half inch to the sharp edge. The wound was approximately one and one-half inches long.

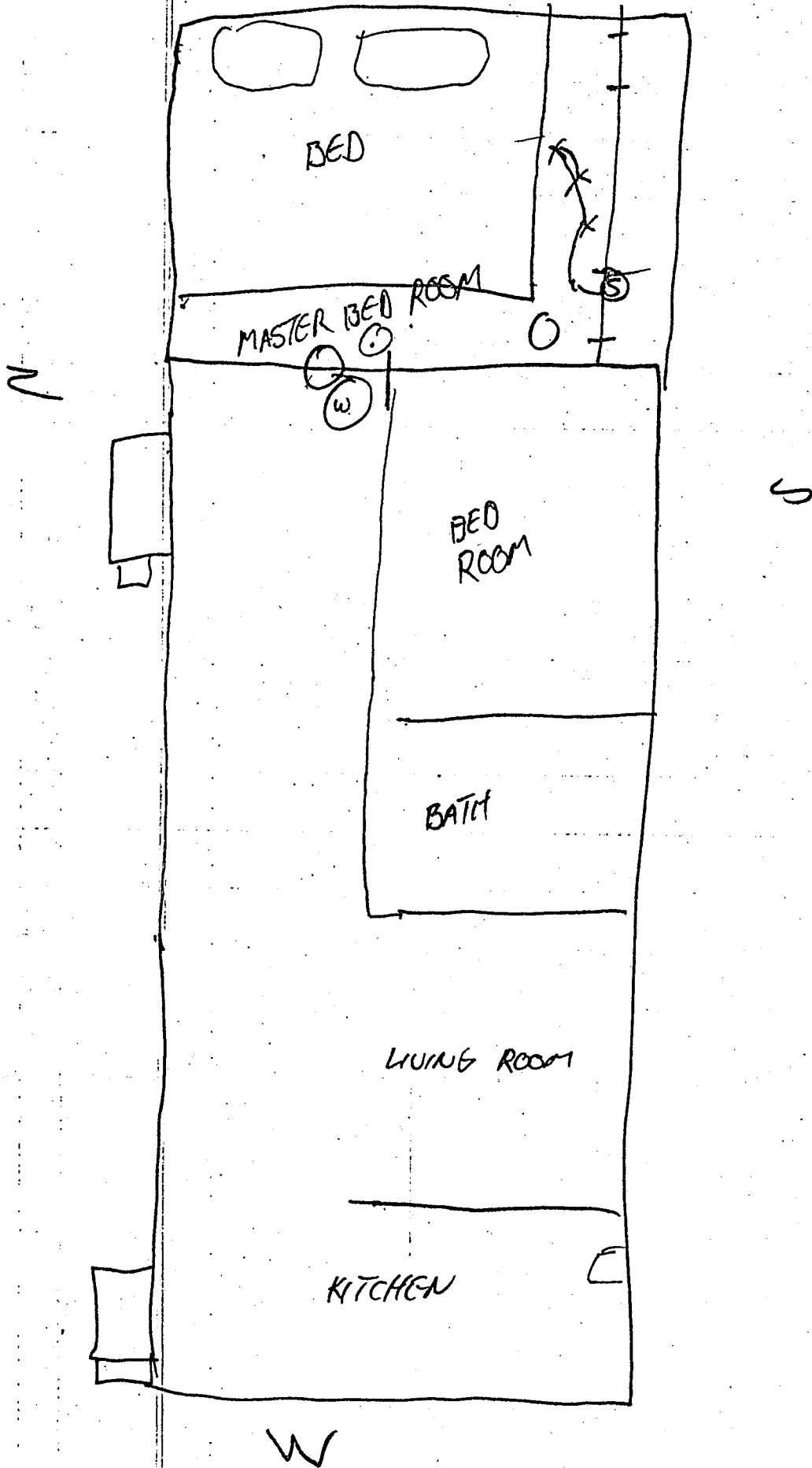
The bullet hole began 17 inches below the top of the head and four inches to the left of midline. Dr. [REDACTED] stated the bullet entered from the right side of the bullet hole.

The hole in the right rear shoulder was 12-1/2 inches from the top of the head and seven inches to the right of midline. The wound had star shaped qualities, and according to Dr. [REDACTED], was definitely an exit wound. The bullet went between the third inner space of the left rib, through a small portion of the left lung, then through the upper portion of the right lung through a vein, then exited through the second inner space on the right rear rib.

The stab wound penetrated a total of seven to eight inches. It went through the second inner space of the left rib, penetrated the left lung and severed a pulmonary artery. The stab wound had a slight downward angle.

Dr. [REDACTED] stated the cause of death was a stab wound and bullet wound to the chest, both wounds being fatal.
